

Four point refresh? Why? How? While not a lot will be changing at KYMS, what is being changed is the focus within our programs. Main Street is one of the best, if not the very best way to create change and revitalize communities. As the new fiscal year approaches and many of you will be working on your work plans/action plans economic vitality is one that needs to be given a lot of attention for 2016-2017 and into the future. Your reinvestment statistics show the great work that is being done and moving forward we need to be seen as leaders of change in the economics of our communities. The information below comes from our friend, Donovan Rypkema.



In case you missed it, we've analyzed the results of our latest PresPoll survey on Main Street! PresPoll #3 asked which of the 4 Points of Main Street was most important to the success of a local program and which of the 4 Points was being done best. The results were revealing if not surprising. Economic Vitality was ranked most important for program success, but lowest in terms of what was being done best. At the other end, Promotions was seen as the least important of the 4 Points, but it was Promotions that was seen as what the local Main Street program does best.

These results suggest that the Main Street Refresh of Patrice Frey and the National Main Street Center is both critical and timely.
