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Narrative Description

Summary Description

The Highlands Historic District, listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1983, is a large mixed-use district in the eastern section of Louisville. The district covers some 760 acres. At the time of listing, the nomination reported the district contained approximately 3,000 contributing structures and approximately 200 non-contributing resources. The current nomination seeks to expand the Period of Significance (POS), from its original span, 1815-1940, to 1815-1962. This nomination form will explore the architectural trends of the World War II and post-War period in Louisville as manifested in the Highlands District. The original nomination states that the Highlands District is a “virtual catalog of architectural types for a period of over 80 years, dramatizing on a local level, the national trends from year to year, subdivision to subdivision.”ⁱ As such, it is only fitting that the revised POS would update the district to include the post-war period, a time when Louisville experienced tremendous growth. Although the impetus for this update focuses on the circa 1950 structure at 904-908 Baxter Avenue, the context established in this nomination will provide the foundation for other resources to be included in the district as contributing.

Development of the District

The Bardstown Road Corridor benefitted from the natural and topographic conditions of its eastern Jefferson County locale. The fertile, well-drained land encouraged flourishing farms and the founding of wealthy estates. In the late-nineteenth century, suburbanization got its start in the corridor, as heirs divided up large parcels and began to develop single-family homes. The introduction of the streetcar facilitated this first phase of residential housing construction. The architecture of Highlands Historic District illustrates an evolution of development from 1815 to 1962. After World War II, the people in the Highlands Historic District, as in many areas across the country, built with an optimism which influenced the development of civic, residential and commercial design of architecture. The development of the expanded POS was influenced by the rise of the automobile, modernist design philosophies, suburbanization and convenience.

Character of the District

The mixed-use nature of the Highlands District results in commercial, industrial and residential properties located within the same block, though the majority of the district is residential in nature. The original nomination does not provide an architectural context narrative for the district; rather, each neighborhood, street by street, is described. The architecture ranges from the early examples of Federal and Greek Revival styles within the district (mostly the remaining estate houses), through the eclectic Victorian styles, to the Craftsman-influenced styles of the first two decades of the twentieth century. The range of revival styles, much favored throughout Louisville, found wide expression in the Highlands District, in both residential and commercial buildings.

Following World War II, as suburbanization pushed outward from the urban core of Louisville, development radiated south along Bardstown Road. Curvilinear streets implemented the ideals of the City Beautiful Movement, while the dwellings in the Bonycastle and Douglass neighborhoods highlight both the upper-class large-scale revival-style houses built in the 1920s and 1930s. Developers paid special attention to the

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topography, with irregularly-platted picturesque subdivisions the result. Smaller scale Craftsman and Revival dwellings of the same period are also concentrated in this section of the district.

Types included within the district range from the large nineteenth-century dwellings fronting on East Broadway, Highland Avenue, Hepburn Avenue, to tightly clustered late-nineteenth- and early-twentieth-century working class dwellings, mainly shotguns, on smaller streets such as De Barr and Christy Avenues. One-, two-, and three-story commercial buildings and apartment buildings are scattered throughout the district. A significant type within the Highlands District is the adaptation of a portion of a dwelling to commercial use with the construction of a one-story addition to the front of the residence, extending out to the street. According to the original nomination, these additions were typically of “red-pressed brick with a parapet wall containing a minimum of decorative elements, a central entrance flanked by display windows, and transom lights.” Beginning around 1915, this phenomenon continued, not just until 1930 as the nomination states, but well past the mid-century mark.

Most of the streets in the Highlands District were laid out by the last quarter of the nineteenth century. Alleys were an important component in the development of the district, and unlike more urban neighborhoods, such as Phoenix Hill, the alleys in the Highlands remain in place and in use. The style and type of housing stock directly relates to the resource’s placement on the main gridiron network or on a less-hierarchical, though still vital, warren of alleys. An alley runs along the rear of the 900 block of Baxter Avenue to this day, providing ease of movement for the disparate users of the buildings in the block, which originally housed both commercial and residential interests. The two major thoroughfares through the district are Bardstown Road and Baxter Avenue. Bardstown Road encompasses all manner of resources, while the northern end of Baxter Avenue is predominantly commercial. The setback will vary from street to street; commercial structures on Bardstown and Baxter have little if any setback, while setback for residential resources changes depending on the era of construction. Late-nineteenth-century houses concentrated in the east end of the Highlands District have less of a setback than some of the later-1930s dwellings located on the other end of the District.

Description of Buildings on the Block

900 Baxter Avenue (Contributing Building in 1983; Contributing Building in 2012)

The two-story brick building at 900 Baxter Avenue was built in 1902 as the Eastern Exchange Cumberland Telephone Building. The Classical Revival Style of 900 Baxter is seen in many turn-of-the-century commercial buildings in the district. Features such as heavy cornices, splayed stone lintels and sills, and decorative window and door treatments, all usually with the interplay between brick and stone emphasized, define this style of building in the Highlands District. The stone foundation rises above grade about a foot, and contrasts with the dark brick of the walls. The foundation treatment is the same on the façade and side elevation.

This façade of 900 Baxter Avenue has a side entrance with two modern full-light entry doors, topped with a heavy hood mold. The entryway is flanked by three windows; two of the one-over-one double-hung windows are paired, with a continuous stone sill. The third window is placed by itself at the northwest side of the façade. A stone belt course separates the first and second floors. The four second-story windows feature transoms above the double-hung sash windows. The center two windows are framed in an elaborate stone surround with curved brackets and ropework. The windows to either side feature stone jackarches but no other treatment beyond the stone sills. The transomed windows on the second story continue on the side elevation (along Breckinridge), with a nine-bay elevation along that more utilitarian elevation. The first story windows display simple one-over-one double-hung sash. The cornice with block modillions and the belt course, continues along the side elevation.

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The building at 900 Baxter Avenue, classified as contributing in the 1983 nomination, retains its integrity with very little material changes since listing. Around the time of World War II, the buildings at 900 and 904 Baxter Avenue began to operate as one commercial entity, with a succession of ancillary and utilitarian additions at the rear of the parcel to accommodate shipping and warehouse needs. The interiors were modified to allow access from one building to another without the need to go outside.

912 Baxter Avenue (Contributing Building in 1983; Contributing Building in 2012)

The two-story painted brick building that anchors the other end of this complex dates from the late-nineteenth century. On the 1905 Sanborn map of Louisville, it was labeled as a blacksmith and wagon shop; many commercial buildings in Louisville had living quarters on the second and third stories. The ground level storefront has been altered to accommodate later professional use. Likely, originally, it had a central entryway flanked by large display windows. Most of the storefront has been bricked-in and now holds a central entry with two modern double doors and transom, flanked by two fixed light modern windows. A stepped cornice line and a course of soldier bricks would have originally delineated the top of the commercial storefront. Several stepped courses of bricks lead up to the base of the two oriel windows on the second story. The oriel windows have three windows, a central four-over-four double-hung sash window flanked by smaller four-over-four double-hung sash windows. A line of dentils accents the cornice line. The side elevations, now mostly hidden from view, feature segmental arched windows with six-over-six double-hung sash windows.

According to the Sanborn maps and City Directories, between the Great Depression and 1960, this group of buildings were occupied by one business, and a series of modifications on the interior facilitated movement from one building to the next. A one-story two-bay wide addition, constructed of concrete block, was added to the side of 912 Baxter Avenue in 1945. The façade has one human-sized door and a garage door. The façade has a brick veneer application designed to blend the building with its historic predecessor. The building at 912 Baxter Avenue, classified as contributing in the 1983 nomination, retains its integrity with very little material changes since listing.

904-908 Baxter Avenue (Non-contributing Building in 1983; Contributing Building in 2012)

The footprint between 900 and 912 Baxter Avenue has undergone many changes between 1900 and 1950. Prior to 1950, a two-story brick commercial building was located at 904 Baxter Avenue, connected to 900 Baxter Avenue on the interior. This two-bay wide, fairly plain structure was most likely built, according to historic photographs, during the 1930s. A one-story brick building was located at 906-908 Baxter Avenue. In 1950, a fire destroyed most of the buildings at 904-908 Baxter Avenue; what was not consumed by the fire was incorporated into a new structure that further linked the two bookend buildings of the business, 900 and 912 Baxter Avenue. The two-bay two-story structure at 904 Baxter Avenue was the least damaged by the blaze, and a line in the brickwork on the façade points to its outline. It received a new smooth brick façade and new fenestration to tie it visually to the two-story building at 906-908 Baxter Avenue.

The “new” building that rose from the footprint of 906-908 Baxter Avenue, is a testament to the new expression of commercial architecture sweeping Louisville and the country in the mid-twentieth century. The architecture of many 1950s-era commercial buildings in Louisville follows faithfully the aesthetic of the Modern movement, with its clean strong lines and minimal architectural ornamentation.

The building at 904-908 Baxter Avenue adheres to this principle, with nine metal casement windows regularly piercing the façade and emphasizing the vertical elements of the building. Despite this local interpretation of the

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nationally influential Modern/International style, the 1950 construction also makes design connections to the Eastern Exchange Cumberland Telephone Building at 900 Baxter Avenue, specifically with the horizontal treatment of concrete (stone on the 900 Baxter Avenue building) at both the sill level and also with the raised foundation. A strong continuous concrete sill, reminiscent of the stone belt course of 900 Baxter Avenue, runs underneath all the windows, the space between, and over the garage bay entry on the façade. The metal casement windows on the first floor were modified during the revised period of significance; the shortened windows allowed more use of the interior for warehouse space, and the inset gravelized panels that took the place of the sash also speak to the minimal and industrial streamlined aesthetic of the post-war era. The second story windows remain unchanged from their 1950 installation.

Changes to 900-912 Baxter Avenue

The rebuilding after the 1950 fire is perhaps the most obvious change within this complex of buildings, but a constant cycle of rebuilding has persisted on these parcels, as is typical within an urban context. Each building considered within this section - 900, 904-908 and 912 Baxter Avenue – may be considered to have two separate identities, one more highly designed, which addresses the public, i.e., the commercial corridor of Baxter Avenue, and one that serves the more private needs of the businesses, which is more utilitarian in appearance, and is oriented toward the rear of the parcel, against the alley.

The dual nature of this complex is expressed physically through the scale, massing and materials employed. At the beginning of the twentieth century, as is evident on the 1905 Sanborn map, the rear of the parcels held a series of frame outbuildings designed to serve the private needs of the inhabitants and the businesses. The map shows a stable, wood sheds, privies and a host of other structures to hold the overflow of a block on which we find dwellings, saloons and businesses.

Building shortages occurred in Louisville during the period between the Great Depression and the end of World War II. The collection of frame outbuildings that lined alleys, built during the pre-1930 period, were torn down and replaced by concrete block structures and/or prosaic building additions, devoid of any ornamentation or much fenestration. These utilitarian constructions enabled the businesses within 900-912 Baxter Avenue to extend to the rear of the parcel and expand their warehousing capability. These additions, in time, would be rebuilt, added onto and altered to meet business needs, with a series of shed roof extensions, loading docks and bays, and an array of different cladding (Photograph 4). The design role of these service additions to the main buildings is one of pure utility, not one concerned with making a public statement. In other words, the evaluation of a building's architectural integrity in this district will generally not regard the physical material in the rear of a property, even material that was present during the Period of Significance, as part of the valuable design intended to enhance the owner's and the business's public identity.

The first extension toward the rear of the parcel occurred with the two-story concrete addition extended down the Breckinridge Street side of 900 Baxter Avenue. The first floor was added first, and later extended to two full stories. The street elevation and presence of this addition lends it a different character than the mélange of additions clustered behind 904-912 Baxter Avenue. This late-1940s addition ties in with the main building in scale and placement of windows, which are steel casements. The second story is clad with metal siding. The concrete block additions, extending from the rear of 904-912 Baxter Avenue, lack any symmetry or attempt to reference the architectural style or massing of the original buildings. Their service-oriented role is clearly defined, and over the years, any integrity of these additions has been subsumed by ongoing revisions and changes.

This form proposes to extend the Period of Significance for the Highlands Historic District to the close of the historic period, given as 50 years prior to the time of the nomination, which is 1962 for a nomination submitted in 2012. This nomination follows that National Register convention.

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Summary Paragraph

The Highlands Historic District (NR ID 83002680) was listed on the National Register in 1983. The nomination led to the listing of one Louisville's largest districts. The form named the styles in the district, chronicled the growth and evolution of the city, pointed to Louisville's first residential suburbs within the district, and saw the district as an important commercial corridor between 1815 and 1940. Though the authors identified many of Louisville's developmental phases, the nomination qualified the district under Criterion C, emphasizing the district's architectural values: the District "includes nearly every architectural style, use, condition, density, color, material, scale, and decorative treatment found in Louisville. The district is a visual catalogue of the evolution of residential and commercial architecture in Louisville, laid out in a very neat, southeastwardly progression."² This revision amends the original nomination, extending the end date for the close of the Period of Significance (POS) from 1940 to 1962. It will explain the importance of the architectural design that defines the post-war years in Louisville. In doing so, a number of resources initially considered to be non-contributing must be reevaluated, to determine the appropriateness of switching their status from non-contributing to contributing. The present Additional Documentation is prepared mainly to support a Contributing status for 904-908 Baxter Avenue. This document contains sufficient architectural information to support that change in status. However, it is submitted in anticipation of a larger follow-up action in about a year, which will update the status of the rest of the resources within the district.

The resources built from 1940-1962 are different from, yet compatible in character with, the resources of the Highlands Historic District that predate 1940. The buildings at 904-908 Baxter Avenue illustrate not only the cycle of rebuilding which forms the foundation for most cities, but also expresses the Modern aesthetic of clean minimal lines, and a frank expression of, rather than reliance upon, applied ornament. These newly contributing resources are in keeping with the qualities expressed in the original nomination, and reflect not only a continuing cycle of rebuilding within an ever-expanding palette of architectural styles, but also represent one of the largest periods of growth – the post-war years - and prosperity in Louisville's history.

Historic Context: Modernist Architectural Design in Louisville, 1941-1962

A Brief Overview of Architectural Design in Louisville up to 1940

Although migration from the urban core to rural areas occurred during the early-nineteenth century simultaneously with the evolution of transportation routes such as turnpikes and rail lines, the process of suburbanization in Jefferson County took root after the Civil War. Suburbanization, strictly defined, is the spread of residential communities on the outskirts of a city.

After the Civil War and up to World War I, transportation improvements, parks, and building and loan associations shaped the nature of residential development in Louisville. Suburban development in the 1870s and 1880s focused on western Louisville, "where developers were able to purchase tracts of level farmland at low prices, subdivide them into lots of a fairly regular size, and then dispose of the lots at a reasonably low price while still making a handsome profit."³ The buyers of these lots, however, were not average residents, but were still fairly well-off professionals with disposable income.

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Parkland, a neighborhood bounded by Broadway on the north, 26th Street to the east, 34th Street to the west, and Woodlawn and Wilson Avenues and Catalpa Street, to the west, is one example of this type of development. A rural tract outside the city's boundaries, the real estate firm of Morris, Southwick and Company auctioned off 1,072 lots in 1871, after contracting with the Central Passenger Railway Company to extend tracks to the area.⁴ The town of Parkland was incorporated in 1874, and 20 years later, Louisville annexed the community.⁵

The foundation of the post-war suburb in Jefferson County formed along the lines of the interurban and the streetcar beginning in the late-nineteenth century. A 1909 article heralding the success of the Beargrass Railway trumpeted that "rapid transit converts country towns near Louisville into charming suburbs."⁶ Streetcar lines crossed Louisville by 1890, and provided convenient access to work, to commercial places, and to social establishments, as well as to homes in developing suburbs such as Cherokee Park and Crescent Hill.

Only around 15 percent of the population lived outside Louisville city limits in the last decade of the nineteenth century. During the "half-century between the end of the Civil War and American entry into World War I, Louisville burst at its seams, moving outwardly to the west, south, and east."⁷ This outward development traveled along major transportation corridors, most notably Bardstown Road.

New Design Introduced to Address Housing Needs

Nationally, new house construction and remodeling expenditures plummeted between 1928 and 1933, and in an effort to spark interest in a public wearied by economic crisis, the "model home" concept debuted. Model homes "were decorated and furnished on the site of the new subdivision development."⁸ Cities across the county held model shows, often with competitions for the design of the home to be built after the show. The World's Fair of 1939, held in New York, featured the "Town of Tomorrow" with 21 single-family model homes on display.

Louisville's first Home Show was held in 1929, and speakers, displays and demonstrations beckoned to the public. Booths hawking lighting, wallpaper and paint appealed to homemakers, while a design competition for architects produced the model home that highlighted the desirable features of the modern home. Architect W. S. Arrasmith won the design in 1920, while Stratton Hammond took top honors in the 1930 show.

No subdivisions were platted in Louisville from 1931 to 1934. The creation of the Federal Housing Administration in 1934 encouraged a scattering of development in the late 1930s, but a full-scale revitalization of the housing market would not transpire until after the war.

By the end of the Great Depression, years of stasis created a housing market that clamored for revitalization, leading to housing shortages, in both for sale and rental housing, that were acute in the Falls City.⁹ A 1941

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survey of the real estate advertisements in the Courier-Journal showed an alarming trend. In 1922, there were 30,000 ads placed annually for rentals, and that number continued to climb through the Great Depression, reaching a peak of 87,385 rental ads placed in 1938. A decline set in, with only 58,798 real estate ads listed in the Courier-Journal in 1940. The first six months of 1941, however, underlined the gravity of the housing crisis, with only 14,353 real estate rental ads placed, half the number in the same period of time in 1940.¹⁰

It is estimated that there were only 6,000 dwelling units available for renters in Louisville in the fall of 1941. The number of houses for sale was woefully inadequate as well. The boom year of 1926, when 60 subdivisions were platted in Jefferson County, saw 68,301 real estate for sale ads placed in the Courier-Journal. As the economy soured, the volume of ads decreased, bottoming out at 19,530 ads annually in 1933. Throughout the rest of the decade, the number of ads for real estate for sale increased, with an estimated total for 1941 put at 60,338.¹¹ Despite the seemingly positive outlook for the sale of homes right before the war, the majority of lower-income, working-class and middle-class residents of Louisville were renters.

A 1945 report by the National Housing Agency, produced in tandem with the Louisville Area Development Association, foreshadowed the dramatic building-out in the post-war years. The report noted that in order to keep up with population increases, Louisville would need to produce at least 5,100 dwellings annually. The combined effects of a population surge after World War II, government incentive programs and the lack of suitable extant housing meant that Louisville was poised for either a crisis or a growth spurt of unprecedented proportions. As one real estate professional commented in 1942, “the real estate and home-selling business in Louisville has always been either a feast or a famine.”¹²

Also, the nature of twentieth-century residential development means that the architectural styles employed tended to be nationally popular revival and Craftsman styles, at least until World War II and the spreading influence of the ranch house. Prior to 1950, there is a marked preference for historical revival houses in the Highlands District; the middle class in Louisville displayed an overwhelming affinity for “Colonial, English, Tudor and Dutch Revival homes during the years before World War II.”¹³

The post-war period did not see a flowering of architectural design. In 1953, critic Grady Clay of the *Courier-Journal*, mused about the fact that for “a long time, it has been possible for a builder to design, build, and sell houses that lacked any architectural distinction – or even many of the essential details of the well-planned house.”¹⁴ A few suburban developments of the period utilized the services of an architect; but most of the homes marketed toward the lower-and-middle class homeowner in Louisville were not architect-designed, and were instead adaptations of popular styles – minimal forms that could be easily and efficiently built.

In her Master's project, *Being Modern in a Conservative Context, the Residential Innovations of Norman Sweet, 1947-1960*, Amelia Alice Armstrong utilized both field work results and extensive archival research to compile types of post-war housing in Jefferson County (Table 5.2). This is a very useful overview of the basic types constructed in Louisville after World War II to meet the demand of would-be homeowners.

Modernist Architectural Design in Louisville, 1941-1962

Within this nomination, the term “Modernist” will be employed to point to a number of architectural styles that were introduced nationally as early as the 1920s, but didn’t see general use in Kentucky until a decade or two later. These will include types of design that have been given the following names: Art Deco, Moderne, International style, as well as others. In most Kentucky towns, the first architectural manifestation of Modernist

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styles was often commercial, whether that built expression was a store, bank or movie theater. Main Street, or arterial or neighborhood commercial corridors, proved the best launching pad for the style, especially considering the conservative approach most Louisvillians shared toward architecture. The primary styles employed in the Highlands District from 1941-1962 include Colonial Revival (and its popular variant subset, the Dutch Colonial Revival), the Neoclassical style, Tudor Revival style, a continuation of the Craftsman and Craftsman Commercial style, and the Moderne and International styles.

According to McAlester, the period of influence for **Colonial Revival** is 1880 to 1950, and the style's rise was fueled by an interest in the dwellings associated with the colonial period, particularly English and Dutch houses on the Atlantic seaboard. The first instances of this style were conspicuously different to the asymmetry and exuberance of the romantic styles of the Victorian era, and were introduced by professional architects. Richard Morris Hunt's house, Sunnyside, in Newport, Rhode Island, dating from 1870, has been identified by architectural historian Vincent Scully as the "first built evidence of colonial revivalism to exist anywhere."¹⁵

By the 1940s, Colonial Revival style had been embraced by most Louisvillians for residential, commercial and institutional construction. There are some features found on Colonial Revival architecture throughout the Highlands Historic District, which distinguishes good design from average Colonial Revival design:

- A symmetrical and balanced façade.
- Entrance details that feature sidelights, broken pediments, pilasters (fluted or not) and door surrounds with dentils or block modillions (these details are found on both commercial and residential buildings).
- Windows are rectangular in shape, double-hung sash, with lights of six, eight, nine, or twelve panes. Windows should ideally be original to the building.
- Masonry is the most common cladding for Colonial Revival (brick veneer), but horizontal wood siding is also typical.
- Commercial buildings in the Colonial Revival style in the Highlands District will feature classical elements such as engaged pilasters (either dividing bays or at the corners) and entablatures, stepped parapetted gables and elements such as garland-and-swag motifs.
- Dutch Colonial buildings usually have the same decorative elements, but with a gambrel roof.

The **Neoclassical style** is typically thought to extend from 1895 through 1950, and is often thought to be synonymous with the Colonial Revival style, which developed during the same period. A national interest in the architecture of the colonies was awakened with the Philadelphia Centennial of 1876. The Chicago's World Fair of 1893, centered on a classical theme, featured architect-designed buildings with dramatic, semi-circular porches and columns in the classical orders. The exposition was covered widely in the press, and images and drawings of the "new" style filtered out into all areas of the country.¹⁶ The Neoclassical style in the Highlands District, which continued to influence design throughout the 1950s, is confined to public, commercial and educational examples. Elements of the Neoclassical style in the Highlands District include:

- An eclectic mix of classical features such as columned porticos, pediments, cornices with dentils, pilasters, keystones, and quoins. Full-height porticos utilized Corinthian and Ionic columns.

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- Boxed eaves with a moderate overhang, often with dentils or modillions beneath. Wide frieze bands are often common.
- Windows should be rectangular, double-hung sash windows, generally with six or nine panes per sash. Bay windows, paired windows, transomed windows and arched windows are also found.
- More restrained ornamentation with an emphasized entablature.

The **Tudor Revival** style persisted in the Highlands District throughout the 1950s. Good examples of the Tudor Revival style in the Highlands District will include the following characteristics:

- Steeply-pitched side gable roofs with at least one prominent front gable
- Large, decorative chimneys, often shouldered, placed in a prominent location such as the façade, alongside an arched entry door.
- The entryway will be elaborated in some fashion, either with a round or pointed arched opening, quoins (or a quoin-lie effect achieved by contrasting material to the main wall surface).
- Decorative half-timbering with stucco or brick infill, which may be commonly found in gables or on second story walls. Brick, stucco, and stone wall surfaces were common.
- Windows are casements of wood or metal, in groups, with multiple panes of glass.

Late-nineteenth-century commercial buildings were updated in the late 1930s and into the 1950s in a blending of Colonial Revival and **Craftsman style**, with storefronts remodeled to feature large, multi-light displays windows, or stepped parapet walls with decorative inset brick panels.

Here is a list of the features found on Craftsman style architecture throughout the Highlands Historic District, which distinguishes good design from average Craftsman design:

- Rectangular shaped windows, with double-hung sash, most featuring an upper sash with vertical lights over single light lower sash. Fireplaces are flanked by two square fixed or casement windows, usually also vertical light.
- A full-width porch featuring battered porch supports (either brick or frame), square supports, wooden or brick balustrades, overhanging eave, detailed with exposed rafter tails or simple brackets.
- Commercial buildings are brick, and will feature decorative stone, terracotta or contrasting brick elements; awnings are common, as is a false parapet wall, either stepped or straight.
- Commercial buildings will, like their domestic counterparts, have a gable or shed roof, but it may be very low-pitched on the commercial building and be clad in tile.

Introduction of Modernist Architecture into the district

Some buildings continued to feature stylized geometric patterns reminiscent of the **Art Deco style** well into the late 1940s. These buildings emphasized the vertical aspect of the façade, with brick and stone highlighting the geometric shapes and patterns of the material and overall massing of the structure. The **Moderne style**, which occurred simultaneously with Art Deco style, softened some of the aesthetic of the emerging Modernist styles, making it appealing and practical for new commercial and industrial construction. The Moderne style also emphasized a simplified form and absence of ornamentation. A more thorough historic context of this style as it occurs in Louisville is found in Miller Paper Company Buildings (Miller and Perry, 2011).

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Buildings in the Moderne style in the Highlands District will include some of the following characteristics:

- Horizontal forms such as polychrome lines, bands of ribbon windows, balustrades. These horizontal accents emphasized movement and speed, drawing inspiration from new designs found in airplanes, trains and automobiles.
- Asymmetrical facades in are also common.
- Smooth facades were emphasized and the roof line was articulated by a small ledge.

The **International style** made a foray into Louisville in both a residential and commercial context. Features of the style include

- Aflat roof, typically without any coping or ledge
- Metal casement windows that were set flush with the outer wall
- Unornamented wall surfaces with no decorative details.¹⁷

The Douglass Arms Apartments, located at 2039 Douglass Boulevard in the District, is built in the International style, “one of the few buildings of the style in Louisville, and one of the best examples.”¹⁸ The circa 1938 structure predates the revised POS, but its characteristics, including a spare, streamlined façade with a mostly flat roof and casement windows, heralds the application of style in a commercial context after World War II.

During the period of expansion for the Highlands District, the influence of Modernist styles in Louisville appears in both a commercial and residential context. The 1983 nomination states that around 27 percent of the resources along the Bardstown/Baxter Avenue corridor, which has become mainly commercial, were considered non-contributing due either to post-1940 construction or due to alterations that had “stripped away” the historic fabric of an early building.¹⁹ The authors of the nomination reiterated the need to consider the commercial strip as an “integral part of each adjacent neighborhood and the district as a whole.” The areas delineated as interruptions in the cohesiveness of the district include the intersection of Grinstead and Bardstown Road and the 1200 block of Bardstown Road between Beechwood and Rosewood. The 900 block of Baxter Avenue is not explicitly called out in the nomination. What is clear from the nomination is the role of the Bardstown/Baxter corridor as the “commercial backbone to this otherwise residential district.”²⁰

The architectural evolution of the corridor is an essential part of its character and integrity; nearly 30 years ago, the evolution continued with “considerable rehabilitation and adaptive reuse” and is “historically important as a reflection of the suburban development of the early twentieth century, the mid-century urban demise and the current return-to-the-city movement as experienced by the Highlands.”²¹

New Materials and the Reinvention of Old Ones

Revolutions in the application and manipulation of traditional building materials – wood, brick and stone – provide one of the structural frameworks for understanding twentieth-century design development. Kentucky’s historic housing stock makes ample use of these materials in traditional ways. Certainly after 1940, we can see

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a willingness to experiment with new building products. “New” versions of concrete, metal, wood and masonry provided an exciting palette for the largest housing boom in Jefferson County’s history.

The impact of World War II on the building and construction industries cannot be overstated. Wartime shortages forced contractors to tweak typical building practices. Traditional building supplies, including iron, steel, wood, rubber and aluminum, led to new and innovative materials as well as some construction shortcuts. As the national economy strengthened after World War II, construction expenditures grew – between 1946 and 1949, they increased almost every year.²²

Concrete

Poured concrete and concrete block are common materials utilized in the construction of new buildings and the rebuilding cycle in the Highlands District. Nearly 75 percent of all concrete blocks manufactured prior to 1915 were used for foundation walls, basement walls or partition walls.²³ Use of concrete block soared nationally during the first two decades of the twentieth century, due to the production of an “improved and reliable Portland cement.”²⁴ Industrial organization also aided the availability of the product; by 1930 the various sizes of concrete blocks from the earlier decades coalesced into the 8-by-8-by-16-inch unit, the new standard.

Promotional materials, including trade journals and catalogues, helped introduce concrete blocks to home-building Americans, just as Sears, Roebuck publicized house styles and forms. The rates of production climbed, from 50 million concrete blocks in 1919 to 387 million in 1930. The spike in housing construction after World War II resulted in the production of 1.6 billion concrete blocks in 1951.²⁵

In an effort to address the issues of weight, lightweight aggregates were added; in 1917 cinder blocks were one of the first to be patented. Additional aggregate materials were added to the manufacturing process during the 1930s and 1940s. These different materials then marketed and promoted their products as the latest and greatest in concrete block technology. In 1930, blast furnace slag treated with water, marketed as Pottscoc, and later as Celocrete, was introduced.

At first, concrete blocks were “faced” or manufactured to have an ornamental facade, in many different ways, including ashlar faced blocks, as well as a treatment that imitated brick and cobblestones. Rockfaced concrete blocks, made to look like quarried stone, were by far the most popular. The setting was “standard on all machines in the period 1900-1930.”²⁶ Most of these blocks were used for foundations.

Simulated masonry, such as Perma-Stone, “played a large role in the changing aesthetics of the American public beginning in the 1930s. The ease of manufacturing of the material, as well as its application – it could be applied as a facing material – ensured its widespread adoption. The brand Perma-Stone, based in Columbus, Ohio, is the best known of simulated masonry products. Perma-Stone, a “molded wall facing made of aggregates, cement, crushed quartz, mineral colors and metallic hardeners, was suitable both for new

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construction and renovation.”²⁷ Louisville had its own Perma-Stone franchise on Preston Highway. Other companies producing simulated stone during the period included Formstone, developed by the Lasting Products Company of Baltimore, Maryland, in 1937.

Evaluating the Significance of 904-908 Baxter Avenue within its historic context: Modernist Architectural Design in Louisville, 1941-1962

The rebuilding cycle of the Highlands District did not end in 1941. At the end of World War II, every section of Louisville, both residential neighborhoods and commercial corridors responded to the changing and growing economy. This busiest period of development in Louisville’s history might irrevocably have changed the landscape outside of the (then) city limits, but it also altered the built landscapes and patterns of development within the Highlands, one of the city’s first suburbs. The building at 904-908 Baxter Avenue is significant within this context as local response to the changing tenor of architecture. With its plain façade, emphasized by vertical swaths of metal casement windows, simple relief form, and the continuous concrete sill, it presented the design qualities of the new Modern style as it appeared in Louisville.

Evaluating the Integrity of the Significance of 904-908 Baxter Avenue in terms of its material form

A building within the Highlands District will be found to be eligible within the 1815-1962 Period of Significance if it retains integrity of design, materials, workmanship, and feeling. All 7 integrity factors of 904-908 Baxter Avenue are discussed below.

Location

The Highlands District has flourished throughout the POS due to its desirable location in Eastern Jefferson County, suitable terrain and fertile soils. The location of the district underscores its place in Louisville’s history. Baxter Avenue was one of two main commercial corridors within the Highlands District at the time of the district’s original listing. Its streetscape had evolved from rail and trolley traffic to the beginning of the reign of the automobile, while maintaining a pedestrian orientation. Rebuilding after a fire at this location underscores the importance of Baxter Avenue, with the amount of traffic through the corridor and its proximity to both downtown and other arterial routes out of Louisville. The building at 904-908 Baxter Avenue retains a high level of integrity of location. The building retains its urban sense, relationship with the street and with the surrounding buildings.

Design

The building at 904-908 Baxter Avenue remains a good example of the simplified Modern style as applied within a commercial context. Its placement within buildings of an earlier time period and style help tell the story of the development of an architectural style and a philosophy that buildings were a “machine for living”²⁸ or in this case, a machine for business and commerce. The plain form, enlivened only by the vertical bands of casement windows, does not aspire to be more than an envelope for the functions contained within the structure.

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This was typical of buildings constructed in the Moderne/International style within the Highlands District during the revised POS.

Materials

The physical elements of the Highlands District underscore the significance of the district being a representative example of suburbanization and architectural styles from 1815 to 1962. Despite some cladding changes, and window replacements, the physical materials of the District remind the viewer of the materials available to local builders and how they chose to combine those elements. The integrity of materials of 904-908 Baxter Avenue, from the original metal casement windows, to the brick veneer and concrete, remain quite high. Though the brick veneer is an applied façade, it is a traditional material that pays homages to the older buildings on either side of it. The shortening of the windows within the revised POS does not detract from the intended focus on the vertical bands of windows, and the gravelized inset panels are another element of the evolving architectural style and changing materials of the day.

Workmanship

Workmanship of buildings should reveal the influences, tools, and skills of the day. The workmanship of the contributing resources in the Highlands District reveals how local builders responded to popular national trends in a variety of ways, whether the building is high-style with a great deal of ornamentation, or is a more-restrained, stripped down structure where function is emphasized over ornament. The building at 904-908 Baxter Avenue has a high level of workmanship, despite its seemingly spare façade and lack of flourishes. That very pared-down aesthetic was the model of the day and the resource speaks to that prevailing notion of the modern, efficient, machine age of the 1950s.

Setting

Commercial, industrial, residential and ecclesiastical uses have merged and co-existed in this block, like the overall Highlands District itself, since the nineteenth century. The setting enables a visitor to gain a sense of the layers of history, building and rebuilding, and responses to city and national trends found in houses, commercial buildings, churches and schools. The neighborhood behind the 900 block of Baxter Avenue, still consists of mostly small frame shotguns fronting on Christy Avenue and Breckinridge Street. The inhabitants of these dwellings have used Baxter Avenue for transport, shopping, entertainment and recreation throughout the POS. The setting of Baxter Avenue and the relationship of 904-908 Baxter Avenue to that streetscape retains a high level of integrity.

Feeling and Association

The Highlands District is still clearly associated with its origins and history of development, from the early-nineteenth century through the middle-twentieth century. The intact materials, design and setting of the district allow someone moving through that landscape, either as a pedestrian or in a vehicle, to observe the passage of time as expressed by the built environment, and experience the way that transportation patterns, national architectural styles and the growth of Louisville influenced these important neighborhoods and corridors.

The buildings from 900-912 Baxter Avenue retain a strong sense of feeling and association with the middle twentieth century, a bustling and booming time in Louisville and the nation. The integrity of design, material, and workmanship provide the feeling of an urban street that has evolved and developed from the late-nineteenth century through 1962. This block provides a strong view of the mixed-use neighborhood that defines so much of the Highlands District, particularly along its two main thoroughfares, Bardstown Road and Baxter Avenue. Though the upper floor of some of the structures, especially 912 Baxter Avenue, would have been residential,

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the buildings could easily accommodate a variety of uses again. The building at 904-908 Baxter Avenue represents another pivotal period of growth in Louisville, and blends in harmoniously with its companions at 900 and 912 Baxter Avenue. Together, the buildings are still clearly associated with the growth and development of the Highlands District.








