Historic Wood Window Workshop

Course Description

This three-day, hands-on workshop will teach the step-by-step process of how to properly remove, restore and re-install the historic wood window.

Every aspect of efficient and effective wood window restoration will be addressed.

Basic tools needed in restoration, repair, and maintenance of the historic wooden window will also be covered. Students will team together to learn paint stripping and repair methodology, including Dutchman, epoxy, glazing, and rope and weight replacement.

A discussion of wavy glass, weather stripping and storm window weatherization will be included.

Participants must wear work clothes and closed-toed shoes or boots.

Jack P. Patchin:

Patchin is the owner of “Ol House Experts” and has over 30 years in the construction/restoration field and has operated his own historic restoration business for over 10 years where he specifically consults and restores windows and shutters for homes that are 50 years and older.

Patchin also served nine years on the maintenance crew for Taliesin Preservation, Inc. conducting maintenance and restoration work for buildings located on Frank Lloyd Wright’s Wisconsin estate, with a specialty of repairing on-site wooden details.

He is a member of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, Preservation Trades Network, and Indiana Landmarks. Patchin currently resides and conducts his business in historic Madison, Indiana - a national historic landmark district.
