Friends,

I so enjoy reading the exciting happenings in your downtowns and have had the opportunity to do some R & D (Rip-off and Deploy) some of the things you have shared. I wanted to share a project that we are working on in our downtown so that others may be able to do their own R & D if they so choose.

One of our projects is a “philosopher’s wall” and we dedicated it (10/10/15) to a gentleman that recently passed who was a longtime supporter and visionary for our downtown. The wall (as you will see in the attached photo) is really the lower façade of one of our downtown buildings. It was painted with a black chalkboard paint that allows for the public to write on the wall their vision for our community. Chalk is provided in a mailbox on site and the local businesses on the street monitor it to make sure no inappropriate language is used.

We are not the first community to do this type of project and other similar projects may already exist in KY (I couldn’t find any online reference to others in KY) so I don’t want to portray this as a unique idea to Madisonville. However, it has been neat to see the community engaged in this manner.

The streetscape project for this street (Sugg Street) is almost complete with redone sidewalks, burial of most of the overhead utilities, new streetscape plantings, and a reworking of a mural that depict Montpelier (James Madison’s homestead for which Madisonville is named after).

The streetscape project was funded by local and federal highway dollars.
The philosopher’s wall was paid for mostly by private donations.

National Register work going on in Main Street districts and beyond. Julie Wagner, Harrodsburg, sums it up as to why this work is important to our downtown communities!

What's Happening at Harrodsburg First?

Our volunteers and committees are working hard to improve our downtown with the goal of presenting a well-maintained, well-preserved district that is full of life and excitement!

Harrodsburg First has agreed to partner with the James Harrod Trust to complete a massive National Register Nomination Program for all properties in and adjacent to the downtown District. Several people have asked, "*Why is Harrodsburg First getting involved with this project, isn't it beyond our mission?*"

Main Street is a subsidiary of the National Trust for Historic Preservation and Harrodsburg First is your connection to the Kentucky Heritage Council as well as the National Trust.

One of the pillars of Main Street is Historic Preservation. Actually, the FOUNDATION of Main Street is Historic Preservation so each and every project we do should have some connection to historic preservation.

A National Register Nomination program identifies and documents historic structures and designates them as valuable to the community.

Getting listed in the National Register opens up eligibility to historic preservation tax credits for commercial and residential properties. Access to tax credits will encourage economic development and preservation projects that would create jobs and improve the local economy.

We hope this brief explanation clears up why your Main Street Program is working on this project, and many other preservation based effort



I will be out of the office beginning on Oct. 30th—Nov 6th attending coordinator trainings and workshops in Washington, DC. I will give you more information as it becomes available. I know you will have questions regarding how this will affect you and we will spend time on this during our January conference. One thing that you can change today is the title Economic Restructuring has in fact been changed to Economic Vitality as we have discussed previously. Stay tuned for further info.

In addition to being out Oct. 30th—Nov 6th in DC I will be out Nov 10-11 working in eastern KY and spending time with Bobbie Gothard in Cumberland, Benham, and Lynch. On the 12th I will be in Owen Co and the 17th I'll be conducting board training in Paris. As always I have limited access to emails and texts, etc. when traveling, but I will respond to you at my earliest convenience.

I have also have submitted an application for our programs to be considered for a two day placemaking training in the summer of 2016. If chosen we will receive fully paid training for up to 35 directors from the nationally recognized staff of Project for Public Spaces. Part of our DC training will focus on Placemaking and in KY we have been working on this for the last two years. In addition we will also need the local leaders to participate as appropriate and assist in a program summary report. So keep your fingers crossed! This will allow us in our pursuits of Kentucky being the best place to be! (of course we already know that)
