



Though founded in England, the Shaker faith left an indelible mark on American culture - from Aaron Copland orchestral suites to an enduring design aesthetic. Known for their simple lifestyle but doomed by their aversion to procreation, the Shakers peaked in the 19th century. In Harrodsburg, Kentucky, however it is still possible to experience "a retreat into a slower, more reflective way of life", says Patricia Schultz, author of 1,000 Things to See Before You Die. There you'll find the Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill, "one of the few restored Shaker communities where you can stay overnight", she says. The Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill provides a glimpse into this part of American history, as well as a lot of lovely scenery - rolling hills, horse farms, stone fences and 3,000 acres (1,214 Ha) of beautiful countryside.
