LIVING ARCHAEOLOGY WEEKEND




Have you ever wondered what life was like in Kentucky a thousand years ago? A hundred years ago? Come to Living Archaeology Weekend and watch the past come to life.

Living Archaeology Weekend is a free, two-day public archaeology event held in the beautiful Red River Gorge in eastern Kentucky. It provides a quality educational experience for school children and the general public.

Primitive technology experts, professional archaeologists, and American Indian tribal representatives demonstrate and describe how native and historic peoples lived in the Gorge.

Visitors are given opportunities to interact closely with demonstrators and to participate in hands-on activities.



DIRECTIONS: From Lexington, take Interstate 64 east to Exit 98 (Bert T. Combs Mtn. Parkway, #402); take the parkway to Exit 33 (Slade Exit); at the end of the exit ramp turn left and go 1/10 of a mile to the junction of KY 11/KY 15. Go 1.5 miles west on KY 15 to KY 77, and follow the signs.
