Kentucky National Register Process:

October 22, 2019, State Review Board

Initial Draft due	June 14, 2019
Completed nominations due	August 1, 2019
State Review Board Meeting, place TBD	October 22, 2019

After a property has been determined eligible, constituents are responsible for completing the National Register Nomination form. From the time we receive a nomination in the office, it usually takes between six months to a year to get a property listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

Initial Draft review: The National Register Coordinator will respond within thirty (30) days. Nominations should undergo at least two revisions prior to presentation before the State Review Board.

Completed nomination is due: August 1 for October Review Board meeting. Completed nominations must have the Coordinator's final approval before submission.

CLG Communities: Federal regulations require that local historic district commissions in communities participating in the Certified Local Government Program (CLG) be notified 60 days in advance if a property in their community is being presented to the Kentucky State Review Board for consideration of listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The CLG communities in Kentucky are: Anchorage, Bardstown, Bellevue, Boone County, Bowling Green, Campbellsville, Covington, Danville, Dawson Springs, Frankfort, Hopkinsville, Horse Cave, Louisville-Jefferson County Metro Government, La Grange, Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Maysville, Middlesboro, Middletown, Newport, Owensboro, Paducah, Pikeville, Shelbyville
