We had a great discussion with the London MS board. I'm excited to see all the great things they will bring to their community.



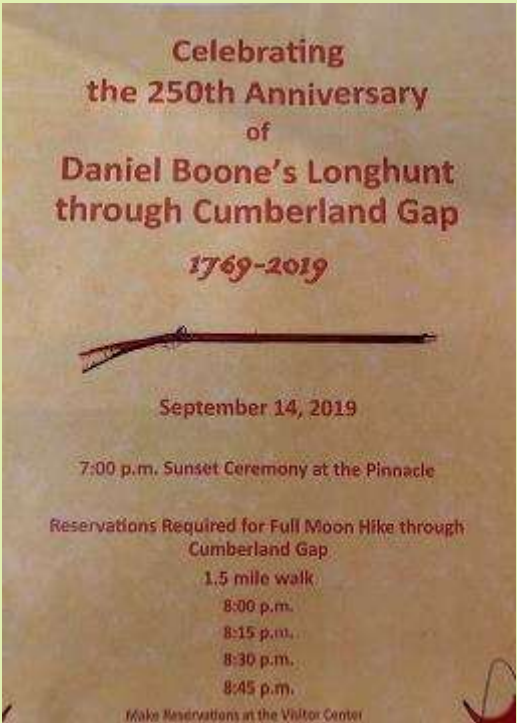

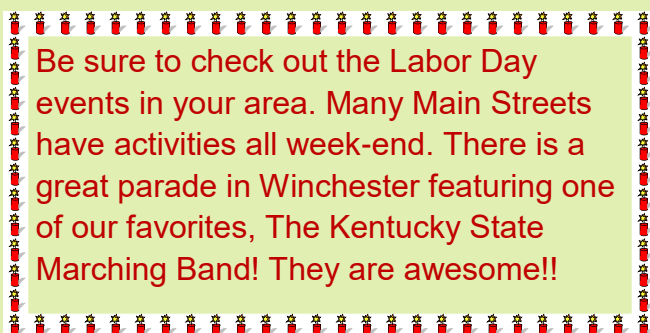


September is shaping up to be another great month for downtown Danville!
