Plant for the Planet grants from Louisville Gas & Electric and Kentucky Utilities are available. **Apply by Friday Dec. 1st.** The matching grants of \$500 to \$5000 will fund qualified tree plantings by nonprofit or government entities with a history of successful tree plantings in the LG&E, KU service territory. "Since launching in 2009 more than 38,000 trees have been planted as a result of the program, & we want to continue working with those who apply to help further expand tree planting efforts across Kentucky," said Angie Evans, director of corporate responsibility and community affairs for LG&E and KU.
