The Federal Save America's Treasures grants program began in 1999 and helps preserve nationally significant historic

properties and collections that convey our nation's rich heritage to future generations of Americans. Since 1999, there have been almost 4,000 requests for funding totaling \$1.54 billion. In response to these requests, \$315,152,000 was awarded to 1,287 recipients.

Grants Currently Available

The National Park Service (NPS) announces availability of \$5 million in FY2017 Historic Preservation Fund grants for the Save America's Treasures (SAT) program. SAT grants provide preservation and/or conservation assistance to nationally significant historic properties and collections. Grants are awarded through a competitive process and require a dollar-fordollar, non-Federal match, which can be cash or documented in-kind. The grants are administered by the National Park Service in partnership with the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), and National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH). How do I Apply?

All applications are due through grants.gov by February 21, 2018 at 11:59 PM EST. In order to submit an application, all applicants must be registered with the <u>System for Award Management</u> and have a **DUNS number**. You should start this process early. Please note, on December 31st, 2017, grants.gov will no longer accept legacy PDF applications and all applications MUST be submitted via Workspace.


Having fun at the
