You Are Invited to Join TPS for an Update on Operations Webinar

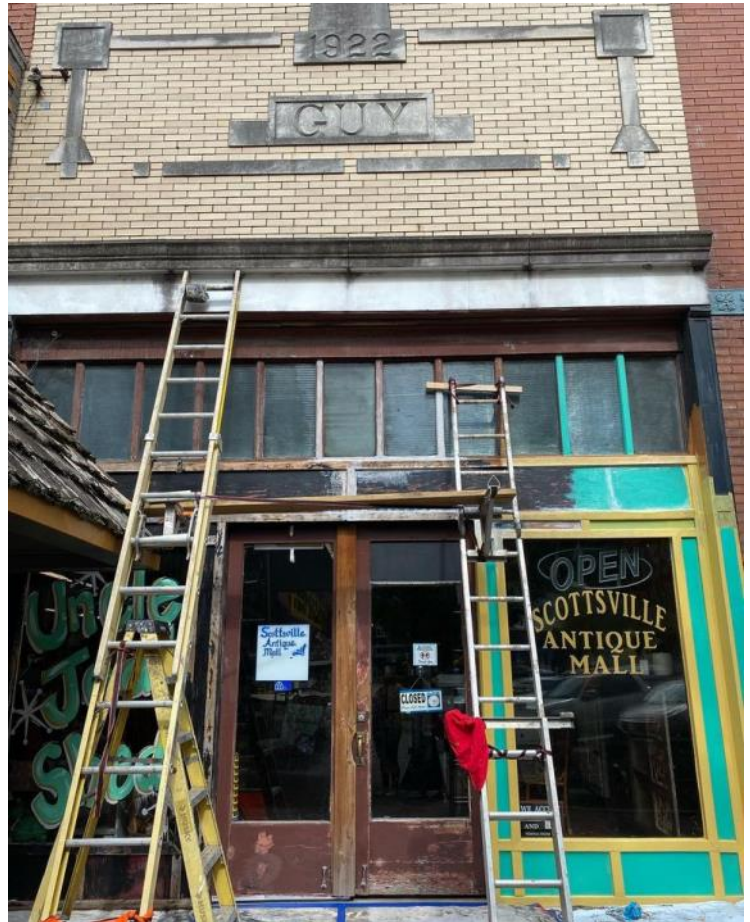

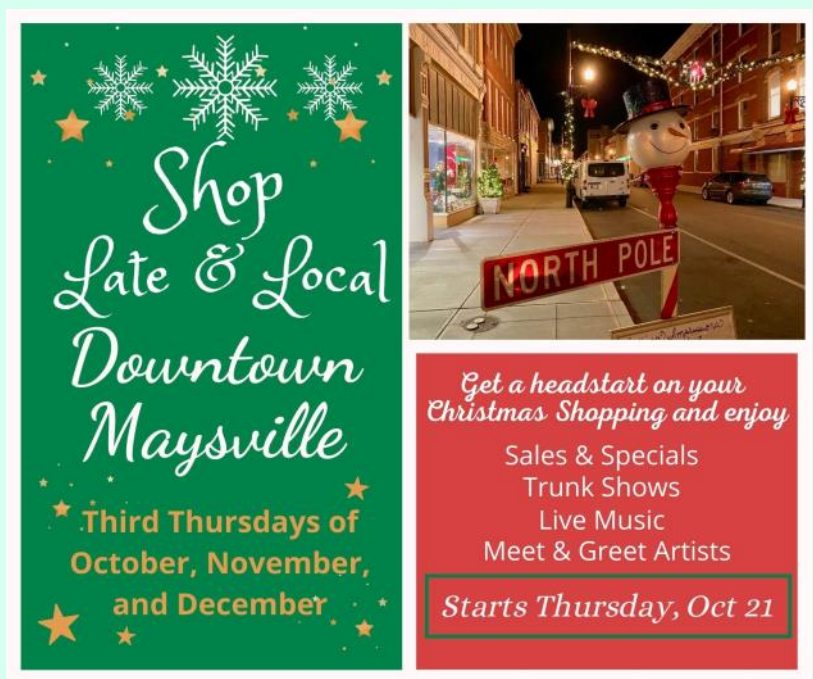

KY Brownfield Cleanup Funding Now Available

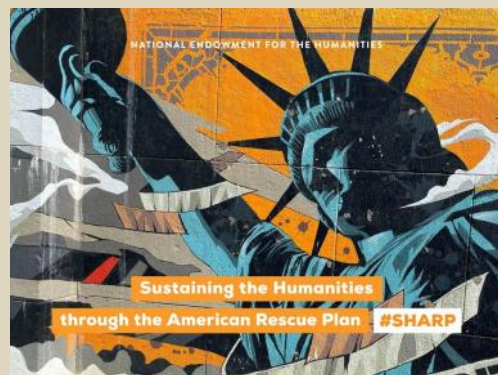
