Where are you from and where do you live now? Born in Memphis, Tenn. Live on a farm in a 1865 farmhouse in Trimble County

How long have you been a Coordinator 8 years

How did you get involved with the Main Street movement? I've been in all of the lower 48 states and across most of Canada and have enjoyed getting off the main roads to enjoy small towns. Nothing like rural America. When the position became open here in New Castle I jumped at the chance to become the Main Street Director.

Which of the Four Points is your favorite? Promotion

What project is consuming most of your time right now? Trying to save the historic Grand United Order of Odd Fellows Washington Lodge #1513 building which was begun by former slaves in 1872. This group acquired this building in 1886 and will celebrate their 130th year in this building next year. It is absolutely imperative we save and renovate this building.

Do you have any favorite activities or hobbies? My main interest other than Main Street is doing what I can to honor WWII Veterans while there is time to do so. Recently flew on two Honor Flights to DC which was incredible. Most WWII Vets are entering their 90's with 500 to 600 passing away every day. About a million of the 14 to 16 million are left and in 5 years a large majority of them will be gone. These men and women of the Greatest Generation changed the world for the better and deserve our utmost respect.


